

Catholic Mobilizing Network to End the Use of the Death Penalty (CMN) carries out the mandate of the United States bishops' "Campaign to End the Use of the Death Penalty" initiated in 2005 (A Culture of Life and the Penalty of Death, 2005).



CMN is a nonprofit, national Catholic organization created to inform and facilitate the death penalty related work of Catholic organizations and institutions. Among other services, CMN provides resource materials and education programs (in English and Spanish), and speakers for conferences and special events.

CMN's office in Washington, D.C. coordinates with state Catholic conferences and national groups whose focus is pro-life issues and restorative justice. A second office at Mount St Mary's University in Emmitsburg, concentrates on death penalty coursework and publications, internships, and development.

VISION

Ending the use of the death penalty is a pro-life issue and reflects the bishops' priority for human life and dignity. Firm in the belief in Catholic teaching on the consistent ethic of life from conception to natural death, CMN seeks to educate Catholics regarding Church teaching on the death penalty. Our vision looks to the day when state sponsored killing in our name is no longer lawful. Inspired by the Gospel teaching of forgiveness, healing and reconciliation, CMN includes restorative justice as an integral part of this vision.

MISSION

Catholic Mobilizing Network to End the Use of the Death Penalty (CMN) supports state bishops' conferences, diocesan offices and Catholic institutions and organizations in their efforts to end the use of the death penalty in the United States and in their restorative-justice initiatives. CMN seeks to prepare Catholics for informed involvement in campaigns to repeal state death-penalty laws and to expand or inaugurate state restorative-justice programs; to proclaim the Church's unconditionally pro-life teaching and its application to capital punishment; and to infuse the public debate with that teaching.
